## PARENT GOVERNOR VACANCIES

I would like to invite parents/carers to stand for election as a parent trustee governor, or nominate another parent to do so. We currently have vacancies for two parent governors at KNGS. This is a voluntary role and an exciting opportunity to have a positive input into the life of Kings Norton Girls' School and Sixth Form and in ensuring the highest quality of outcomes for all of our students. Our governing body are a very welcoming and supportive group.

The board of trustees, with the headteacher, has overall responsibility for the running of the school. The board of trustees have three core strategic functions:

- Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction.
- Holding the Headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its students.
- Overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent.

Parent governors need no special qualifications, experience or knowledge, they do need to have a keen interest in the school and be prepared to play an active part in the board of trustee's work. However, to fulfil our duties effectively, our Governing Body needs a balance and diversity of skills, experience, backgrounds and perspectives, we would therefore welcome nominations from parents with legal, human resources or change management experience.

We are also keen to increase the diversity of our board of trustees to reflect our school community and wider society and would particularly welcome applications from ethnic minorities. Training is available for all trustees and our governing body has an expectation that those new to being a governor attend free induction training. Appointed parent trustees must also undertake an enhanced DBS check in order to be able to take up their post.

Nominations must be from parents or individuals exercising parental responsibility, of a child at Kings Norton Girls' School and Sixth Form. Self-nominations will be accepted but if you are nominating another parent, please seek their prior consent. If there are more nominations than vacancies, the election will be by secret ballot. If that is necessary, voting papers will be sent to all parents together with details of the ballot procedure after the closing date for nominations.

#### YEAR 7 SACRED BUILDINGS VISIT

"On Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> January, Poppy Westwood and my fellow class mate Elsie Harrison went on the Year 7 Sacred Buildings trip.

We first travelled to the Bebe Nanaki Gurudwara. The hosts of the visit welcomed us politely as we encountered the spectacular interior of the Gurdwara. Firstly, we took our shoes off to show respect and placed them on a shoe rack. Then we were led upstairs heading into the main prayer room where there were multiple interesting features. The ceiling was gold, shiny, rectangular shaped with a light dangling downwards. In front of us was a raised platform and inside was a white, large bed with curtains



around the sides where the Guru Granth Sahib (the holy scripture for Sikhs) was laid. There stood a host delicately



waving a chauri (white fluffy feather like brush) over the bed. Elsie and I learnt that the building is also used for marriages, baptisms and eating! We were kindly offered samosas in the Langar (kitchen) by our hosts.

We then left the Gurdwara and travelled to the Shree Geeta Bhawan Mandir. As we entered, it was different because everything was within one room. The hall had a carpeted floor and the five murtis (gods) around the room, so people (both visitors and hosts) could observe and pray to them. We learnt that Hindus believe in reincarnation and one of the models also known as 'the goddess mother' has eight hands which each represents different things!

The final visit, to Darul Barakaat Mosque, was our personal favourite because it had an intriguing impact and made us keen to learn more. Muslims have two different prayer rooms, which were both very plain so they can focus on praying, one is for women and the other for men. The Imam led the prayer in the men's section. We had a question and answer session where we were able to ask more questions to help with our research.

The visits we made have helped us to consider various features of sacred buildings in preparation for our project on multi-faith buildings. We had a great time on our tremendous trip!"


#### **Congratulations Ms Wells!**

#### **Admissions**

For September 2020 we have received in total **291** applications – this includes both internal **(110)** and external **(181)** students.

Applications form external student have been received from a variety of

schools including KNBS, Bournville, Turves Green Girls' & Boys', Kings Edwards, Queensbridge, and The University of Birmingham School.

Out of all the students we have interviewed so far, both internal and external, **214** of them are saying we are their first choice sixth form. We look forward to welcoming our potential new students for September 2020!

#### **Challenge Day**

This year, Year 12 visited the University of Birmingham to gain a further understanding of Higher Education. The day was structured so that students could learn about how to begin researching a University, what student life is like, and the importance of Year 12 when it comes to laying those foundations of knowledge.

Year 13 took part in a Health Day with workshops focused on sexual health, alcohol, finances, exam health and relaxation.

#### **Art, Photography & Textiles London Gallery Visit**

In December, straight after mock exams, art, photography and textiles students from both Years 12 & 13. The

students had a very full and strenuous day (we walked over 20,00 steps!) but it was worth it.

We visited five galleries and eight exhibitions, The Wellcome Collection, The Victoria and Albert Museum, The Photographers' Gallery, The National Gallery and The National Portrait Gallery. The exhibition at the V&A by Tim Walker of his fantasy fashion photographs was particular popular. All the exhibitions we visited have provided plenty of creative inspiration for the students and we look forward to seeing the work inspired by the trip in the forthcoming weeks.

We arrived back in Birmingham, later than anticipated due to railway problems, exhausted but culturally satisfied.





In early January, Emma Lambert, a photography tutor from Coventry University, visited KNGS to run a one-day photobook workshop for both Year 12 and Year 13 photography students.



She started by sharing her extensive collection of photobooks which the students found both fascinating and inspirational. This collection even included a photobook made



from teabags. The second half of the workshop was a 'hands-on' photobook making session where everybody had the satisfying sensation creating their own

book. This will, no doubt, prove to be a very useful skill for the students to use when presenting their final images.

## PARKING OUTSIDE SCHOOL

#### IT IS ILLEGAL TO PARK ON ZIG ZAG LINES

It is illegal for anyone to stop, park/wait, drop off or collect students on the zig zag lines outside of school at anytime. These road marking are in place to safeguard students.

## **PARENTPAY**

#### **SETTING UP ALERTS**

Could all parents please ensure that their maintain a balance on their ParentPay account for the school's catering provision. If you child does not



have sufficient funds on their account then they may be refused service. You can set an alert on your ParentPay account so that you receive a free email when your child's balance goes below a certain amount (It's a good idea to set this at £3 as then you know they will always have enough for a hot meal). You can do this by following the steps below:


- Log into your ParentPay account
- Click on Communication at the top of the page
- Click on Alert Settings on the left hand side of the page
- Scroll down to Balance Alerts
- Enter the amount you want to be alerted at
- Tick the email box
- Scroll down and click on Save

You should then get an email to confirm that you have made those changes and your child will not run out of funds on their account again.
