Relationships and Sex Education Policy Consultation

You may be aware that in June 2019, the DfE published new guidance on "Relationships education, relationships and sex education (RSE) and health education" (June 2019). This guidance:

- Makes it compulsory for all schools to have an RSE Policy and to consult parents and carers in the development of that policy;
- b) Sets out the topics that need to be taught to students by the end of secondary schools; and makes changes to the right of parents or carers to withdraw their child from the elements of sex education that are not taught as part of the compulsory national science curriculum.

School have a responsibility to start delivering this guidance from Summer 2021 at the latest.

I have now updated the Kings Norton Girls' School RSE Policy and we are now in a position to consult on this policy. I would very much welcome your feedback. Information on the consultation, links to the policy and Microsoft forms consultation feedback can be found on the following page.

RELATIONSHIPS & SEX EDUCATION (RSE) POLICY CONSULTATION

Background

- 1. This consultation seeks your views on our Relationship and Sex Education (RSE) Policy in line with requirements from the Department for Education (DfE).
- 2. In June 2019, the DfE published "Relationships education, relationships and sex education (RSE) and health education" (June 2019). This guidance:
 - Makes it compulsory for all schools to have an RSE Policy and to consult parents and carers in the development of that policy;
 - Sets out the topics that need to be taught to students by the end of secondary schools; and
 - Makes changes to the right of parents or carers to withdraw their child from the elements of sex education that are not taught as part of the compulsory national science curriculum.
- 3. These and other topics are covered in our RSE Policy and RSE Curriculum map. The new requirements formalise expectations but don't make significant changes to what we already teach our students. The topics required by the DfE were already taught as part of our Personal, Social and Health Education (PSHE) curriculum, and in other subjects.
- 4. We have worked hard to make sure that our curriculum reflects:
 - Our value of respect for all students and communities;
 - Our students' age and maturity levels, as well as their cultural and religious backgrounds;
 - · Every students' learning needs; and
 - What students need to know to be healthy and safe in school, in their personal relationships and in the wider world.
- 5. This consultation has been published on the schools' website. Parents and carers are invited to submit responses to the consultation questions at the following link:

- 6. The deadline for responses is 30th November 2020.
- 7. We will consider responses to the consultation by **18th December 2020** so that our RSE Policy can be published before the start of the **Summer Term 2021**.

141 students have successfully enrolled into Year 12 subject to meeting entrance requirements.



16-19 BURSARY FUND

The Bursary Fund is designed to help support those young people who face the greatest barriers to continuing in education or training post 16. The level of support offered may vary during the academic year and is dependent on the amount of funds available. Students will need to complete an application form and supply evidence of need or eligibility as appropriate before assistance is provided.

Application forms are available from the Sixth Form Common Room or can be obtained by contacting Miss Jenny Brookes, Sixth Form Administrator.

UCAS APPLICATIONS

The deadline for Oxbridge is 15th October and for all other applications is 15th January 2021. The internal deadline for students is 29th November – this is when all students are aiming to have their UCAS completed by so that they can focus on their formal examinations.

All staff have completed student references and please do encourage your son/daughter to carry out thorough research into their options post-18. They have UCAS and Unifrog at their disposal which will provide them with lots of information concerning higher education courses, training, and apprenticeship opportunities.

If they require any more help they should speak to their Form Tutor in the first instance, or Mr Tom Charlett who is in charge of IAG.

HAPPY, SAFE HALLOWEEN/BONFIRE NIGHT - REMINDER FROM WEST MIDLANDS POLICE

With the darker nights fast approaching, it is important that students are reminded what we, as a school community, expect of them in terms of behaviour.

Parents/carers and students should already be aware that as part of our safeguarding arrangements, the school has a two-way information sharing agreement in place with West Midlands Police, and we are active members of the local Police & Schools Panel. This joint-approach helps us to intervene early to prevent and reduce crime and anti-social behaviour involving our students, and provide support and up-to-date safety messages.

Sadly, this year's Halloween, Bonfire night and the half term break will look very different due to COVID-19, so please be aware of the legislation and rules in place linked to this. Remember it is now a legal requirement to wear a mask on all public transport and within communal areas such as shops, cafes, restaurants and bars and we must maintain social distancing, ensure we abide by the the rule of six, and the bespoke rules for Birmingham regarding entering other people's homes: https://www.birmingham.gov.uk/coronavirus_advice | https://www.gov.uk/coronavirus

In partnership with the police, we would also like to remind our students about the following:-

- Anti-social behaviour: Halloween can be a scary time for people who don't like surprises or callers at their door. Think
 about how your actions and behaviour affect others; elderly and vulnerable people may be frightened by 'trick or treat'
 so look out for signs in windows that people do not want callers at their door.
- Personal Safety:
 - Be aware of your surroundings, take care of friends and family members and keep valuables such as phones out of public view whenever possible.
 - Don't drink alcohol, take illegal drugs or unknown substances; they can have a big impact on your health and safety, behaviour and your ability to do well at school and enjoy other interests and activities. They can also be addictive and have unpredictable side effects, including sudden death!
 - West Midlands Fire Service recommends that you go to an organised display; it's the smart way to stay safe.
 You'll see a lot more fireworks and it's a lot cheaper. Information about firework safety is available at www.saferfireworks.com
- Weapons in public places: carrying a knife will get you a criminal record which can have life-long effects on travel and
 job prospects. Those who carry knives are also much more likely to be injured by them.
- Off-road bikes: These can only be ridden on private land with the landowner's permission. Don't risk your life and future prospects by illegally riding these on the road.
- Remember the company you keep: if your friend breaks the law, you may also be held responsible for that crime –
 even if you weren't the one directly responsible.

DROP OFF & PICK UP AT KNGS



- in front of an entrance to a property.
