Well done and thank you we have successfully got the end of a very different and challenging Autumn term, and we have much to celebrate.

I am delighted that the schools progress and achievement have been recognised nationally. Kings Norton Girls' School & Sixth Form has been shown to be one of the top comprehensive schools in the West Midlands over the last decade, ranking in the top 3 comprehensive schools in the West Midlands and in the top 190 across the whole country! With the dedication of the staff and students I have no doubt that we can ensure this continues.

Congratulations to all staff and students over the past decade that have made this possible.

Not only have we all worked together to ensure students continue to learn and make excellent progress but we have also contributed to our wider community. Staff and students at KNGS have contributed to the sKIDs COVID surveillance testing for Public Health England, with more participants than any other school. And as a school we raised £1794 for Children in Need, with 7HRI raising £468 of that. Well done.

I have been impressed with how Year 7 and 12 have settled in this term, and their excellent



attitudes to learning. One advantage of year group bubbles is that Year 7 have been able to decorate their tutor bases. I have much looking enjoyed judging this competition of festive decorations, which began to appear in November!!!

This term has been a challenge but really successful, and thanks need to go to so many people:

To our **incredible teaching staff** who have adapted to a completely new way of working this term to ensure that whether students are in the classroom or at home learning, they have continued to make excellent progress.

To our **amazing non-teaching staff**; the Student Support team, Heads of Year, IT and network support, cleaning and site teams and our administrative staff as they have all taken on additional work to implement new procedures to make sure that school is running smoothly in order to keep us all as safe as possible and that students can work effectively in and out of school.

To our parents and carers for your continued support and patience this term in some really difficult situations. For updating the school in a timely manner relating to positive COVID cases and your diligence in supporting us in minimising the spread of COVID. Thank you to the parents/carers that also responded to our Relationships & Sex Education Policy Consultation. We received 36 responses and comments were positive. Students benefitted immensely from the forum and greatly valued the thoughts and experiences shared, inspiring them to express their own views in class discussions.



KS3 OCEANIC LIFE HANGING PROJECT

After our time in lockdown and isolation over the last few months, the Year 8 and 9 KS3 students are working together to create a collaborative stitched Oceanic Life inspired hanging panel during their DT Textiles rotation. Students undertake research into contemporary and historical designers influenced by Sea Life as a theme in their work and research existing hanging products to help inform their final design outcomes.

Each student creates a textiles panel using a variety of hand embroidery, applique and mixed media techniques and materials. The panel is then stitched together to create an enormous Oceanic Life hanging and will be displayed in a prominent position in school when complete. These are a few of the panels completed so far, we are currently stitching them all together, there will eventually be over 300 panels. Students have been working really hard and should be very proud of their creative accomplishments.
