



# YEAR 12 STUDENT WINS ASTON UNIVERSITY LANGUAGES COMPETITION



# YEAR 7 STUDENT WINS BOURNVILLE BOOKFEST COMPETITION





#### SIXTH FORM ADDMISSIONS 2021

Kings Norton Sixth Form have had a phenomenal amount of applications this year for September 2021. So far 385 applicants have accepted conditional offers; 115 of these are from our current Year 11 students, and 270 are external applications.

Summer work for each subject will be available to all of our applicants on the school website from Monday 7<sup>th</sup> June. This work is designed to aid transition from GCSE to A Level.

#### **ENROLMENT**

Our applicants who have accepted their conditional offer will receive enrolment packs before the end of term in July. These will provide all the necessary information regarding enrolment day in August.

#### **ASSESSMENTS**

Year 12 will begin two weeks of assessments after half term. We know they have all been revising hard and we would like to wish them the very best of luck.

#### **UCAS**

Once Year 12 have finished their assessments we will be beginning the UCAS process with them. We will be providing them with lots of information and tips, and will be encouraging them to carry out thorough research into their post-18 options. They have UCAS and Unifrog at their disposal to provide them with lots of information concerning higher education courses, training and apprenticeship opportunities. It's never too soon to start planning!

# **DROP OFF & PICK UP AT KNGS**

The majority of parents continue to support us in keeping KNGS students safe by driving and parking in a safe and responsible manner.




