COLLABORATIVE MINDFUL QUILTING PROJECT UPDATE

The textiles quilting panel has now been fully sewn together and hung in pride of place in the Hall to be enjoyed for many years to come. There are 200 individual squares created by 200 individual students that have now been sewn together by our fantastically creative Textile

Ambassadors; Aimon Parveen, Lydia Morse-Brown, Navneet Wilkhu, Bess Thompson, Chloe Lam and Eleanor Hodson.

This has been an epic creative journey for many of our students. The creative process started during the COVID and lockdown period of school life where over 200 students that were in Year 8 and 9 who began the panel are now in



Years 11 and 12. This has been an incredibly successful project which allowed students to stay connected during some difficult and often challenging and lonely times. We were able to focus on some positive mindful stitching adding applique and developing a range of hand embroidery stitches with the knowledge that each panel would form part of a much bigger picture.

We hope that students will see this as part of their creative legacy which will hopefully be displayed for many more generations to enjoy.

THE DOG MENTORING PROGRAMME

We are pleased to announce a brand-new initiative called The Dog Mentoring programme, has started in school this term with several selected pupils. The Dog Mentor programme is built upon the benefits of the human-animal bond by providing pupils positive experiences with dogs, that can help them educationally, developmentally, emotionally, and socially.



This scheme assesses dogs for suitability, then trains those selected dogs and the trainer, to work with pupils in schools. The two dogs that will be joining us are Ami (Amaretti) and Bisco (Biscotti), they are a very special breed of Italian hypoallergenic, non shedding medium size dogs. For centuries these dogs have worked with humans. They are motivated by love, loyalty and wanting to work and to please.

Over the years, the Dog Mentor programme has been proven to have a positive impact on children in all areas including self-esteem, behaviour, peer relationships

and better engagement skills. These improvements then result in improved academic achievement.

Our Dog Mentor will be bringing Bisco and Ami into school one day a week, which began at the start of March.

This is a document that is published on our school website to inform parent/carers about the SEND provision at KNGS.

- 3. What training do the staff have to support pupils with SEND?
- 4. How do we consult and involve parents of children with SEN and involve them in their child's education?
- 5. How are young people with SEN consulted and involved in their education?
- 6. How do we **support students with SEN through transition** between phases of education, and preparing them for adulthood and independent living?

Mrs Everson and Dr O'Mahony have really enjoyed seeing the work develop. Well done Art club!




West Midlands Regional Schools

Students Finance 2024

As our students are starting to receive offers from universities we emailed the following advice from the from the Student Loan Company (SLC) Website. We have also had a session on student finance with the Year 13's as part of their tutor programme this half term.

SLC is encouraging prospective students to starting planning their student finance as Student Finance England (SFE) launches its <u>mailing list</u>. The full-time, undergraduate application service for the 24/25 academic year is expected to open in March 2024, and by signing up, students will be among the first to receive an email when the application service goes live.

SLC advises students to apply as early as possible for their student finance, even if they don't have a confirmed place on their course. This helps to ensure that their funding is in place at the start of term. Students in England can apply for Tuition Fee Loans to cover their fees and Maintenance Loans to help with their living costs.
