Students were able to meet club leaders, ask questions, and even sign up on the spot. The fair was a fantastic opportunity for students to try something new, connect with like-minded peers, and find communities where they can develop their skills and interests outside the classroom.

### YEAR 10 BLETCHLEY PARK VISIT

Our Year 10 Computer Science students recently enjoyed an inspiring and informative visit to **Bletchley Park**, the historic home of British codebreaking and birthplace of modern computing.

The day began with an engaging "Data Protection by Design" workshop, where



students explored how principles of privacy and security are built into today's technology from the ground up. They examined real-world scenarios, considered the ethical implications of data use, and discussed how these ideas connect to their GCSE studies.

Students then had the opportunity to **explore Bletchley Park's fascinating wartime exhibits**, learning how the efforts of Alan Turing and his team helped shorten the Second World War. The **Cold War galleries** provided further insight into how intelligence and encryption continued to shape global history in the decades that followed.

A highlight of the visit was the **temporary exhibition "The Age of Al"**, which showcased how artificial intelligence is transforming the world today — from creative industries to cyber defence. Students were particularly interested in drawing links between the pioneering work at Bletchley Park and the cutting-edge Al technologies that define our era.

It was a fantastic day of learning, reflection, and inspiration — one that brought computing to life beyond the classroom and encouraged our students to think about the ethical and innovative roles they may play in the digital future.


### **SPANISH CULTURE CLUB**


The charity aims to combat racism through education and awareness, reinforcing the importance of principles like



### WORLD MENTAL HEALTH DAY- FRIDAY 10TH OCTOBER 2025

On Friday 10th October, some of the Year 13 Wellbeing Ambassadors were in the hall promoting World Mental Health Day 2025. This year's theme set by the World Federation of Mental Health is:

'Access to services - mental health in catastrophes and emergencies'.

The theme highlights the importance of people being able to protect their mental health in times of global instability. Students were asked to think about the following questions:

- Do you spend too long 'Doom scrolling'?
- Do you feel overwhelmed & upset by global events on the news?



Students from across the whole school were invited to 'Nibble and Natter' to encourage discussions about our mental health and ways in which to improve it. The free sweets and biscuits provided were definitely a hit with the students who swarmed around the table to claim their favourite sweet treat! The Wellbeing Ambassadors also handed out green ribbon and wellbeing stickers and there were numerous resources available such

as word searches, quizzes and tips for improving our mental health.

Particular thanks go to **Wellbeing Ambassadors**, **Lily M** and **Roisin H** for their help and to everyone who came along.

- Every year, 1 in 4 of us will experience a mental health problem.
- Over 2 million people are currently waiting for NHS mental health services.
- Since 2017 the number of young people struggling with their mental health has nearly doubled.
- The Guardian (August 2024) reports that 3 children and young people in the UK are referred to CAMHS every minute, or almost 4000 a week, for anxiety-related mental health problems.

# **Drop Offs & Pick Ups at KNGS**

The majority of parents continue to support us in keeping KNGS students safe by driving and parking in a safe and responsible manner.

Unfortunately, there are some parents/carers/family members that continue to stop on the yellow lines (zig zag and single lines), block our neighbours' driveways and carry out dangerous turning manoeuvres in the road. All of this in spite of being asked politely by school staff not to do so. As a reminder the Highway Code, <a href="https://www.highwaycodeuk.co.uk/parking.html">https://www.highwaycodeuk.co.uk/parking.html</a> section 243 states:

#### DO NOT stop or park:

- near a school entrance,
- opposite another parked vehicle,
- where the kerb has been lowered to help wheelchair users and powered mobility vehicles,
- in front of an entrance to a property.

We have also received complaints from our neighbours relating to idling engines. Whilst waiting for students please can you support local residents and school in protecting the environment by turning your engines off whilst waiting to collect students. Rule 123 of the Highway Code, states: "You must not leave a vehicle's engine running unnecessarily while that vehicle is stationary on a public road." Doing this can incur a £20 fixed-penalty fine under the Road Traffic (Vehicle Emissions) Regulations 2002, rising to £40 if unpaid within the required timeframe.

There are over a thousand students entering and leaving the site on a daily basis, please don't put them at risk just because you want to save a few seconds. Drive, stop and park responsibly.
